

Scriptures associated with the Hill Riplah war:

Alma 43:22they durst not come against the Nephites in the borders of Jershon; therefore they departed out of the land of Antionum into the wilderness, and took their journey round about in the wilderness, away by the head of the river Sidon, that they might come into the land of Manti and take possession of the land;

Alma 43:27... Moroni caused that his army should be secreted...near the bank of the river Sidon, which was on the west of the river Sidon in the wilderness.

Alma 43:31 Therefore, he divided his army and brought a part over into the valley, and concealed them on the east, and on the south of the hill Riplah;

Alma 43:34 And it came to pass that the Lamanites came up on the north of the hill, where a part of the army of Moroni was concealed.

Alma 43:35 And as the Lamanites had passed the hill Riplah, and came into the valley, and began to cross the river Sidon, the army which was concealed on the south of the hill, which was led by a man whose name was Lehi, and he led his army forth and encircled the Lamanites about on the east in their rear.

Alma 43:41 And it came to pass that Moroni and his army met the Lamanites in the valley, on the other side of the river Sidon, and began to fall upon them and to slay them.

Alma 43:52 Therefore the armies of Moroni encircled them about, yea, even on both sides of the river, for behold, on the east were the men of Lehi.

Correlations with Riplah war and Hill Chabilchoch:

- The directions and distance between hill Riplah and Antionum are reasonable.
- The head of the Sidon-Pasion River is positioned to match up with the requirements of hill Riplah as well as the south wilderness and Antionum.
- A valley on the southeast side of hill Chabilchoch matches the description mention in Alma 43:31
- Lehi's army had to go over the hill to reach the southeast valley.
- The valley on the northwest of the hill matches the description in Alma 43:27.
- The Lamanites had to climb up over the hill as described in Alma 43:34.
- The reason that Lehi's army and the Lamanites had to go over the hill was because the river ran under the hill.
- After the Lamanites went over the hill, Lehi's army followed them and encircled them from the rear on the east side of the river.
- Moroni's army met the Lamanites as they were crossing the Sidon River.
- The Lamanites fled toward Manti but were met by the armies of Moroni.
